The Belt and Road Initiative foresees infrastructure investments and the establishment of trade links throughout Asia, Africa and Europe in the staggering amount of almost USD 1 trillion. Japan's government recently has adjusted its strategy and decided to become more involved in the Initiative in order to explore new business opportunities for Japanese companies. This in turn means that Japanese lawyers will need to become familiar with the key issues and opportunities associated with it.

The seminar will provide a general introduction to the Belt and Road Initiative and its potential implications for ADR practitioners in Japan. It will explore what steps other jurisdictions undertake to benefit from the Initiative and will place a particular emphasis on career opportunities for young Japanese lawyers practicing international arbitration and mediation.
